

Prof Dr Danuta Wasserman

Professor of Psychiatry and Suicidology at the Karolinska Institute (KI), Stockholm, Sweden, Danuta Wasserman is the Founding Head of the National Centre for Suicide Research and Prevention of Mental Ill-Health (NASP) at KI.

Professor Wasserman is the Director of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Research, Methods Development and Training in Suicide Prevention since 1995. She is also President of the European Psychiatric Association (EPA), former President of the International

Academy of Suicide Research (IASR) and Honorary President of the Estonian-Swedish Institute of Suicidology.

Professor Wasserman is the author of several hundred scientific articles, reports, book chapters and books. She is the editor of the "Oxford Textbook of Suicidology and Suicide Prevention: A Global Perspective" and has received several National and International honours and awards. In 2012, she received the British Medical Association Medical Book Award for her book "Depression: The Facts, Second Edition" published by Oxford University Press.

Professor Wasserman's research activities include the epidemiological, psychodynamic and genetic studies of suicidal behaviours. She is the Principal Investigator of two large-scale randomized controlled trials (RCT) funded for €3 million each by the European Union.
